



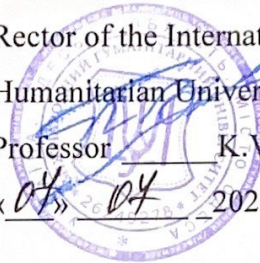

The main focus of the program	<p>Special education in the field of 29 'International Relations', specialty 293 'International Law'.</p> <p>The main focus of the educational-professional program is the theoretical and practical training of students in the field of international law, the formation of competencies sufficient for understanding international law, European Union law, comparative law, international private law; solving problems in the field of professional activity within national, foreign and international jurisdictions; ability to conduct their own scientific research; ensuring the interaction of international law with the legal system of Ukraine.</p> <p>Keywords: international law, comparative law, human rights, international cooperation, international organizations.</p>

Program features	<p>The program provides training for competitive specialists with theoretical knowledge in the field of national and international law and practical skills, in-depth study of two foreign languages, formation of students' professional translation skills. The features of the EP are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - combination of theoretical and practical training of students; - internships in government bodies, local self-government and law firms working with individuals and legal entities of different nationalities and jurisdictions; - organization of classes with the involvement of practitioners; - combination of studying international law with comparative constitutional, comparative civil, comparative criminal, comparative judicial law, etc., which allows comparing international public law and national legal systems; - participation in professional training courses with obtaining certificates, - participation in international mobility projects; - academic staff teaching disciplines have undergone internships in Ukrainian and foreign higher education institutions, - updating the educational-professional program is carried out through active involvement of key stakeholders - employers, students.

Teaching and learning	Student-centered learning: lecture courses are combined with practical classes, seminars, debates, brainstorming sessions, learning in small groups; methods of stimulation and motivation, control, correction of the effectiveness of educational and cognitive activities, problem-solving methods, case method, professional games are applied in the educational process; independent work based on textbooks and lecture notes, consultations with instructors.
Assessment	<p>Assessment of the quality of mastering the educational program includes ongoing and final knowledge control and final certification. Ongoing assessment in seminar classes (oral questioning or written express control, student presentations during discussions, tests, reports from practice, presentations, essays, etc.) Final control - exam/credit (assessment based on the results of ongoing control).</p> <p>Assessment of educational achievements is carried out on a 100-point scale ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System), a national 4-point scale ('excellent', 'good', 'satisfactory', 'unsatisfactory') and with pass/fail grading systems.</p> <p>Types of control: ongoing, final, self-control.</p> <p>Final certification - an examination in international law and a qualification examination in a foreign language.</p>

8. Resource support for program implementation

Staffing	All academic staff involved in the educational process have academic degrees and titles and have confirmed high level of scientific and professional activity. Academic staff have at least three years of scientific and pedagogical experience and a level of scientific and professional activity that is confirmed by the fulfillment of at least four types of results listed in paragraph 30 of the Licensing Conditions. In order to improve their professional level, all academic staff undergo internships , including international ones, according to the professional development plan every five years.

9. Academic mobility	
National credit mobility	National credit mobility is carried out based on agreements between the International Humanitarian University and other higher education institutions in Ukraine. IHU transfers students from other higher education institutions in Ukraine in the specialty of International Law with the transfer of educational disciplines within the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS). Credits obtained at other universities in Ukraine are transferred according to the certificate of academic mobility.
International credit mobility	Students studying in this educational program have the right to participate in international academic mobility within the deadlines and conditions provided by the legislation of Ukraine and the regulatory documents of the University, both within the framework of concluded agreements and international programs, as well as individually. In case of simultaneous studying in higher education institutions in Ukraine and another country, an individual study plan-schedule is developed with the completion of the corresponding certification.

Requirements for certification exams	<p>Certification exams are conducted to verify the compliance of the quality of education of higher education applicants with the requirements of the educational program 'International Law'.</p> <p>Both theoretical knowledge and the level of formation of relevant competencies are checked.</p> <p>The comprehensive exam is conducted according to a program that includes the most significant, generalized questions from several programs of professional (professionally-oriented) disciplines preparation.</p> <p>The certification exam is conducted in written and oral form by providing answers to the questions asked.</p> <p>The qualification exam in a foreign language (Ukraine) is conducted according to a program that includes provisions on the basic concepts of jurisprudence, grammatical and stylistic requirements of professional orientation.</p> <p>The structure and conditions for conducting qualification exams are determined by the educational program for the training of bachelors in international law.</p>
