Programme orientation	Educational programme is focused on training of highly qualified specialists in the field of international law.

Features of the programme	The master's programme includes a wide range of elective courses, which account for 25% of the total workload. The programme includes not only theoretical disciplines, but also applied specialised courses. The programme provides for the training of competitive professionals with theoretical knowledge in the field of national and international law and practical skills, in-depth study of a foreign language, and the development of professionally oriented translation skills. An individual approach is used to determine the place of internship (each student can independently find a place for internship, taking into account employment plans and the subject of the master's thesis).
Suitability of graduates to employment and further education	
Suitability for employment	After obtaining a diploma in international law, graduates have the right to be employed by state authorities, local governments, international judicial bodies, international organisations, legal entities of various forms of ownership, and public organisations, in particular, to hold positions in: the Bar; notary; court; customs; prosecutor's office; police; bodies of the Security Service of Ukraine; bodies of foreign relations; international intergovernmental and non-governmental organisations; international judicial institutions; justice bodies; local governments; companies, I to be a teacher, researcher; to be a translator.

Teaching and assessment	
Teaching and training	General learning style - Problem-oriented. Lectures courses are combined 3 practical classes, seminars,

	discussions, brainstorming sessions. The training takes place in small groups, which allows for student-centred learning. The following methods are used in the educational process: stimulation and motivation, control, correction of the effectiveness of educational and cognitive activity, and problem-solving. Independent work based on textbooks and lecture notes, consultations with by teachers is defined as a personality-oriented pedagogical interaction of learning subjects
Evaluation	Assessment of the quality of the educational programme includes current and final control of knowledge and final certification. Current assessment during seminar classes (oral questioning or written express control, student presentations during the discussion of issues, tests), test control, practice reports, presentations, essays, etc. The final control is an exam/quiz (assessment based on the results of the current control). The final certification is the defence of the final qualification work.

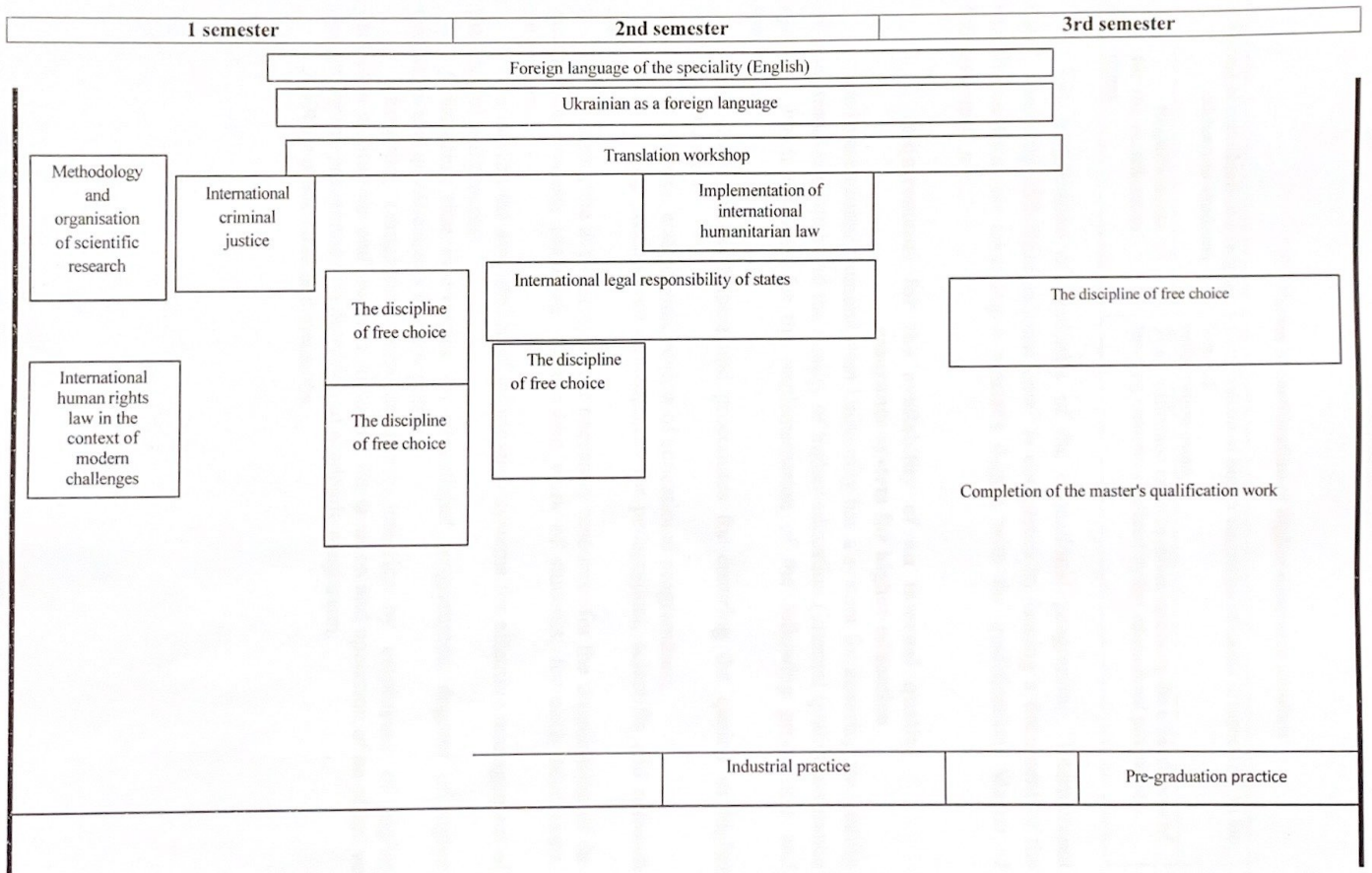

Requirements for the certification exam	The certification exam involves assessing the achievement of learning outcomes defined by the educational programme.

The certification of graduates of the educational programme "International Law", speciality 293 "International Law" is completed by issuing a document of the established form on awarding a master's degree with the qualification: Master of International Law.

Requirements for the availability of an internal quality assurance system for higher education
